This side-event, organized by the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and Quaker United Nations Office (QUNO), and co-sponsored by the Permanent Mission of Ireland to the UN, Human Rights Watch, the International Detention Coalition (IDC), Caritas Internationalis, and the International Catholic Migration Commission (ICMC), aims to discuss issues related to the protection and promotion of the human rights of all migrants and refugees, underscore the centrality of human rights ahead of the General Assembly's High Level Meeting, and explore the role of the Human Rights Council in this regard.
